



Women Deliver is a global advocacy organization bringing together voices from around the world to call for action to improve the health and well-being of girls and women. We work globally to generate political commitment and resource investments to reduce maternal mortality and achieve universal access to reproductive health.

→ **GROUNDBREAKING CONFERENCES** Women Deliver's conferences are the largest global convenings to focus on the health and well-being of girls and women. In 2010, more than 3,400 people from 146 countries convened in Washington, DC, including five UN agency heads and the UN Secretary General. Our third conference—**May 28 to 30, 2013 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia**—was even bigger, with attendees from more than 150 countries, 75 parliamentarians and government ministers and more than 250 global media outlets.

→ **SPOTLIGHT ON REGIONAL ISSUES** Women Deliver held regional consultations in 2012 in sub-Saharan Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean, and Asia, each with a NGO partner. In 2013, we held a consultation for the Middle East and North Africa region. These meetings brought together regional experts, decision-makers and advocates to identify best practices, success stories and ongoing challenges to improve maternal health.

→ **FOCUS ON NEW PARTNERS** We work to expand the community of partners dedicated to bettering the lives of girls and women. Our corporate forum brings together private sector representatives to collaborate on projects and solutions. We work with ministries of finance and health and global development experts to make the economic case for investing in girls and women. And, we look to the future by developing the skills of young advocates in developing countries through our workshops and online community.
